Voting

You can vote by mail starting May 1, in person on advance voting days (June 8-13) or in person on election day (June 26). You should receive a Voter Information Card in the mail. Please visit toronto.ca/elections for more information, including the location of your voting station.



Allowing candidates to canvass in your building

It is any candidate's right to access potential voters for the purpose of canvassing. This includes knocking on doors, talking to tenants and leaving flyers behind.



Putting up election signs inside your home

Examples include in your window or on your wall.

Please Avoid:



Putting up election signs on your balcony or in common areas of your building

This is both dangerous and against the law.



Sharing personal information you are not comfortable sharing

This includes with candidates who come to your door, or with anyone else. TSHC will not share tenant lists with candidates or political parties. We respect tenant privacy.
